Adams & Broomfield Counties, CO – CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) of Adams and Broomfield Counties invites you to learn how your voice can make a difference in the life of an abused and neglected child at their 'CASA 101' Information Session on Thursday, January 12, 2012 from 6:00 – 7:30 PM at the Anythink Library located at 9417 Huron Street in Thornton, CO. 'CASA 101' will provide attendees with an overview of the program which is currently seeking caring, community volunteers to advocate on behalf of abused and neglected children who have open cases in the judicial system.

“This year alone, over half a million abused and neglected children in our country will be unable to live safely at home. Over 1,300 of these children live here in Adams & Broomfield Counties,” said Bill Christopher, CASA of Adams & Broomfield Counties Board Chair. “Many of these children have been removed from their homes and live in foster care. These children don’t have to remain in the system though, as a CASA Volunteer you can help ensure a child is placed in a safe, permanent home.”

CASA of Adams & Broomfield Counties is looking for individuals who are interested in becoming CASA Volunteer Advocates. CASA is a non-profit organization that recruits, trains and supports dedicated community volunteers who represent the best interests of abused and neglected children who are involved in the court system, through no fault of their own.

Christopher added, “Through CASA you can help ensure that children who are in foster care or in the care of the county are placed in safe permanent homes quickly. You can also help advocate for their best health and educational needs. Over 75% of CASA Volunteers have full-time jobs and families; many others are retired or semi-retired people that continue to make a difference in their communities. All it takes is 10-15 hours a month and the desire to make a difference in the life of a child!”

CASA staff members and volunteers who are active on CASA cases will be on hand to speak with guests about the program, as well as help those interested in taking the next
